Women's Studies - Selected Media Titles

Not the Numbers Game - Video 6270-6275

A series of women's issues films made by women filmmakers that explore a number of fundamental issues that were debated at the Cairo Conference. Covers areas such as: India, Uganda, Bosnia, Peru, Indonesia, and Cambodia.

A Question of Rights: World of Difference - Video 6260-6264 A series that explores what governments, communities, and individuals are

doing to ensure that women's rights are recognized in Ethiopia, Latvia, Jamaica, and Fiji.

Welcome to Womanhood - Video 6265

Discusses female circumcision ceremonies in the remote Kapchorwe region of Uganda.

Fire Eyes: Female Circumcision - Video 5368

Explores the socio-economic, psychological, and medical consequences of this ancient custom which affects 80 million women.

Margaret Sanger - Video 6210

Using rare footage and diary excerpts, traces Sanger's life and exhaustive work in the promotion and legalization of contraception.

She's Nobody's Baby: History of American Women in the 20th Century - Video 5903

Traces the evolution of the roles and lives of women in the 20th century. Includes newsreel footage, stills, radio and television footage, cartoons, and period music.

Women (part of the series *History of the 20th Century*) - Video 5692

Looks at women's struggles, charting the milestones over the past 100 years, as women worked to improve their position in society, from the battle for suffrage, to control over their own bodies through contraception.

Discovering Women - Video 5316-5321

A series that follows the careers of pioneering women in the world of physics, biochemistry, archaeology and other sciences.

Defending Our Lives - Video 4665 Oversize Exposes the magnitude and severity of domestic violence in this country.

Women of Hull-House - Video 4182 Oversize
Created from historical photographs, tells the story of Hull-House and the remarkable contributions of Jane Addams and other women to the history of social welfare, education, women's rights, sociology, and many other areas of American life.

Fairer Sex? - Video 4164

An ABC Prime Time Live episode that set out to discover whether there are daily differences in being a male versus a female in today's American society.

Nobody's Girls: Five Women of the West -

Video 6171 The true story of five extraordinary women who were pioneers in the American West. Blends journal entries and dramatization with rare archival footage and photographs to add a new understanding of the women of the West.

League of Their Own - Video 3570

Documentary that describes the All American Girls Professional Baseball League, the first professional sports team for women in the US.

Life and Times of Rosie the Riveter - Video

2811 Five women reminisce about their jobs and working conditions during World War II.

Hearts and Hands - Video 2533

The primary materials of women's lives - diaries, letters, photographs, and quilts - are pieced together to tell a story of 19th century women.

How We Got the Vote: The Struggle for Female Equality - Video 2174

Original films, photography, cartoons and personal interviews tell the story of the early 20th century women fighting for rights.

Sins of Our Mothers - Video 7383

Depicts the true story of a woman who was shunned and criticized because her actions were contrary to 19th century moral standards.

Common Wealth of Women - Video 1792

Glancing over 350 years, depicts famous and little known Virginian women who have had influence on their families, communities, and the country.

First Ladies - Video 2723

An overview of this country's first ladies from Martha Washington to Barbara Bush.

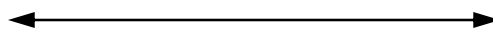
Heaven Will Protect the Working Girl -
