## Early English Books Online, 1473-1700

From the first book published in English through the age of Spenser and Shakespeare, this incomparable collection now contains about 100,000 of over 125,000 titles listed in Pollard & Redgrave's *Short-Title Catalogue (1475-1640)* and Wing's *Short-Title Catalogue (1641-1700)* and their revised editions, as well as the *Thomason Tracts (1640-1661)* collection and the *Early English Books Tract Supplement*. Libraries possessing this collection find they are able to fulfill the most exhaustive research requirements of graduate scholars - from their desktop! - in many subject areas, including: English literature, history, philosophy, linguistics, theology, music, fine arts, education, mathematics, and science.

## Sample Searches

## Basic Search

1. Find the *Canterbury Tales* written by Geoffrey Chaucer.
  - Type *Canterbury Tales* in the **Keyword** box
  - Type *Chaucer* in the **Author Keyword** box (or use the **Select from a list** link)
2. Find works about herbal remedies.
  - Type *herb\** and *remed\** in the **Keyword** box
  - Use truncation to find herb, herbs, herbal, herbalist, etc.
3. Find Various Subject Keywords relating to Brain.
  - Click on **Select from a list** next to **Subject Keyword** box
  - Type *brain* and click **Look For**.
  - Click on **Brain—Early Works to 1800**. Then click **OK**.
  - View the illustrations within your results list to see early medical diagrams.

## Advanced Search

1. Find early works printed by William Caxton, the first English printer
  - Type *Caxton* in the **Imprint** box and click **Search**
  - Sort by *Earliest Publication First*
2. Find a map of Massachusetts.
  - Type *Massachusetts* in the **Keyword** box.
  - Scroll down to the **Illustration Type** box.
  - Click **Map** to highlight the term, then click **Search**.
3. What works were printed in Algonquin, a Native American Language?
  - Scroll down to the **Language** field
  - Click on **Algonquin** to highlight the term, then click **Search**.
4. Other interesting topics to search
  - Magna Carta
  - Pirate\*
  - Housewi\*
  - Nautical
  - Tobacco

<b>Keyword(s) Basic</b>	<b>Reel Position</b>
Searches for your term(s) within the full record. The search terms are combined using the Boolean operator 'OR' by default	Search the reel number and position of the microfilm document. EEBO is online version of UMI's microfilm collections of the Short-Title Catalogues.
<b>Author</b>	<b>Illustration Type</b>
Searches for terms only within the Author field. If you're unsure of the spelling of a word, consider using the Author browse index on the Select from a List page.	Search documents containing one of 14 different illustration types (ex. Portrait, map, music) using the multi select list.
<b>Title</b>	<b>Limit by Date</b>
Searches for terms within the Title field only of EEBO documents. If you're unsure of the title of a work, consider using the Title browse index on the Select from a List page.	You can restrict a search for a document within a particular date range. The default dates are 1473-1900, or 1641-1645 in the case of the periodicals search.
<b>Subject</b>	<b>UMI Collection</b>
Searches for terms within the Subject field only of EEBO documents. If you're unsure of the subject of a work, consider using the Subject browse index on the Select from a List page.	Search an individual UMI collection for documents.
<b>Bibliographic Number</b>	<b>Source Library</b>
Searches for the alphanumeric entry found in the Short-Title Catalogues: Pollard & Redgrave, Wing, or the Thomason Tracts	Search the library where the original document is held. "Cambridge, "Oxford," "Trinity College," and "Eton College" are some of the most common source libraries.
<b>Imprint</b>	<b>Language</b>
Search for publisher, city of publication and date of publication.	Search for documents published in a certain language. Over 30 languages are included.
	<b>Country of Origin</b>
	Search for documents published in particular countries.
