**Instruction and Outreach**

Library instruction and information literacy continues to be central in the fulfillment of the Libraries mission to the University. Therefore, the Research and Instructional Services department has continued to enhance instruction through such efforts as integration of innovative technology in instruction, as well as integration of assessment to garner feedback on the usefulness of instruction provided.

With the ongoing efforts of the University QEP's First Year Experience Program that emphasizes inquiry skills, which are synonymous with information literacy skills, the RIS department contributed to the development of several of the FYE courses within the Colleges.

The following are the instructive sessions provided by the University Libraries, with the corresponding number of participants reached during the 2012-2013 review period:

All first-semester graduate students in the Department of English are required to take this course. **Other accomplishments include enhancement of the instruction infrastructure in the University Libraries:**

- The updates made in the last year include:
  - Newman 207A Technology upgrade
    - New wall-mounted touch screen control panel and A/V components all upgraded for HD
  - SCALE UP room opened with 8 70” HD displays, touch-screen control panel and ability to connect to the A/V system from any one of nine locations around the room. RIS

- developed the operational guidelines and installation of utilities to enhance the teaching experience in the room
  - 22 new laptops were procured for use in the SCALE UP room to support group activities integral to the SCALE-UP Teaching model. These laptops operate using Windows 8.
- Initial phase in the development of an online learning platform – Lear2Research
- Proctoring services have become one of the sought-after services, as a result of the University's growth in the online learning sector. Over 2,000 discrete proctoring sessions have been completed by RIS personnel at the Blacksburg campus during this review period.
- The NVC Library Resource Center also continued to see an increase in proctoring requests. RIS personnel at the NVC administered over 330 tests this year. Considerable time was involved in answering questions and making arrangements for these written and online tests.

## **RESEARCH SUPPORT**

### **Reference/Research Support**

High quality subject-specific and general reference services to the academic community continue to be provided by the Business, Humanities & Social Sciences, and the SciTech reference teams. Over the past year there was a continuing decline of overall reference questions answered. This trend is common among many libraries as users become more proficient in conducting research independently. We also have observed an increase in virtual consultations between librarians and users, such as use of Skype and other Web 2.0 tools. The department will continue making special efforts to support students and other researchers working in an online environment.

Some highlights of accomplishments that exemplify the Libraries support for research across the disciplines include:

- The Government Information specialist spearheaded efforts through an Association of Southeastern Research Libraries (ASERL) program for Virginia Tech to submit a Memorandum of Understanding to become a Center of Excellence (COE) for the Agricultural Research Service, Superintendent of Documents stem A77. As a COE we are committed to the long-term goal of creating and maintaining a comprehensive collection for the Agricultural Research Service both retrospectively and prospectively, developing subject expertise, and making the collection available to others.
- Co-sponsored and co-planned the Office of Geographic Information Systems and Remote Sensing (OGIS) Symposium held April 19, 2013
- Participation of RIS faculty as a co-principal investigator in the interdisciplinary Digging into Data grant project led by Tom Ewing, Associate Dean in the College of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences
- Initiation of new liaison services to the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) community
- Support by RIS faculty for State-wide agricultural interests, as an information resource for the Virginia Cooperative Extension and the Agricultural Experiment Station

- Participation of several RIS faculty on Dissertation Committees of graduate students within their liaison departments
- Collaboration of RIS faculty with the Center for Applied Technologies in the Humanities (CATH) to evaluate current digital projects and map future steps for sustainable preservation
- Collaboration with RIS and CDRS in the establishment of the Port: research Commons, envisioned as a consulting space, collaboration space, and 'digital sandbox' for students, faculty, and staff to explore emerging software and digital research praxis.
- Teaching and/or co-teaching of credit courses by RIS faculty in their respective colleges and departments
- Ongoing user support of bibliographic management tools. Currently supported tools include EndNote, Zotero, and Mendeley
- Ongoing user support of statistical software. Currently supported products include SPSS and NVivo
- RIS faculty partnership with the Director of Undergraduate Research, to create and present workshop on effective poster presentations for 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Undergraduate Research Conference at Virginia Tech

#### *Research support at the A+A Library*

The Art + Architecture Library alone saw a total of 57,566 patrons during the 2012-2013 academic year, or an average of 3,915 patrons each month. Library staff carried out approximately 2,397 reference/directional questions this year. Reference questions were maintained in house and also logged in an online survey.

In addition to meeting the information needs of students and faculty, the Art + Architecture Library also responded to numerous queries from community users and individuals, including alumni, across Virginia and outside of the state, including the Washington-Alexandria Architecture Center (WAAC), collectors, and faculty and students from other colleges and universities.

The Library circulated 16,563 items over the course of the year. This figure represents a drop of slightly more than a 9% from the previous year, in line with trends across the University Libraries. It may also be accounted for by extended loan periods that went into effect this year. We received 1,316 ILL/desktop delivery requests.

The Art + Architecture Library sponsored an exhibition of New York graphic designer Rocco Piscatello's complete poster works, as part of a series events leading up to the College of Architecture and Urban Studies' 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary forthcoming in 2014

#### *Research support and outreach at the Vet Med Library*

The following are highlights of research support activities emanating from the Vet Med library over the past year:

- Taking inventory and weeding of the Veterinary Medical Collection in advance of the renovation of the library scheduled for the summer of 2014. 719 items have been withdrawn from the collection.

- Maintained extended hours during exam periods during the Fall 2012 and Spring 2013 Semesters as requested by students. As students had tests immediately after the Thanksgiving and Spring Breaks the Library reopened on the Sundays after these Breaks.
- Due to the Teaching Hospital being opened, the Library remained opened on Dec. 27<sup>th</sup> through 31<sup>th</sup>, 2012.
- The Library continued to scan article requests for Inter Library Loan Service and sending them online directly. A total of 770 articles were scanned this reporting period, an increase of 46%.
- The Library continued to participate by sending withdrawn books published in the last 10 years to the Mongolian Book Collection Project.
- The EndNote “Supplemental Materials Manual” consisting of responses to queries from users continued to be compiled as a trouble-shooting tool for EndNote users.
- Provided orientation every summer for MAOP (Multicultural Academic Opportunities Program) students.
- Continued to update Vet Med Journals notebook
- Submitted 2013/2014 Library Budget for Audio Visual equipment service contract to the College of Veterinary Medicine.
- By hosting and moderating VETLIB-L, a listserv for international veterinary medical Libraries (in 27 countries) the Virginia Tech Veterinary Medical Library were able to procure journal articles for faculty and researchers which InterLibrary Services had cancelled either it could not locate in U.S. and Canadian Libraries or are articles that are “pre-print
- The Veterinary Medical Library manages the Reading Room Library in the Equine Medical Center in Leesburg by providing resources and reference service to the faculty and students of the Center. The Veterinary Medicine Librarian visits the Center annually to take inventory of the collection and to conduct workshops. Expenses for the trip is being paid for by the College of Veterinary Medicine.
- The Veterinary Medical Library also provides library services to veterinary alumni across the country. Expenses for this service (sans manpower) is borne by the College of Veterinary Medicine
- In addition, the Veterinary Medical Library also provides library services to the veterinary communities in the States of Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia that do not have veterinary colleges.

### *Research support at the NVC Library Resource Center*

This year was the start of a new partnership with Hokie Passport Services. The staff at the NVC Library Resource Center now produce Hokie Passports, the official Virginia Tech identification card for faculty, staff, and students. After the initial sessions and training with Hokie Passport personnel in September, the Library Resource Center established a regular schedule of production. A total of 161 Hokie Passports were produced during this initial year.

The Resource center made formal contact with 281 library users through classes, new student orientation sessions, and appointments. Furthermore, staff at the Resource Center assisted library users with informational and reference questions totaling 3,897 and had a total gate count of 21,900 visits.

The Resource center participated in the National Capital Region's Graduate Education Week with a "Lounge at the Library" session that included light refreshments, fielding questions, and highlighting services and resources available to students. Staff also assisted the NCR's Graduate Student Services Office in preparations for the new student orientations in August and January and commencement in May.

The staff at the Resource Center also created exhibits that commemorated anniversaries of some of the most important events in history: the War of 1812, the Cuban Missile Crisis, and the Emancipation Proclamation. These exhibits helped to highlight the many research materials and methods available through the University Libraries.
